Subject: WebQuest description

Colleen and Erin,

I went to the WebCT site from last fall and found Colleen's description of your WebQuest. So, I'm saving you time and effort and will use that description. If you want anything changed for my final version of the book, let me know. Here's what I have:

Two masters students in my class, Erin Barrett, Instructional Design, Development & Evaluation and Colleen Tierney, Library and Information Science-School Media, collaborated on a WebQuest on the Iroquois Confederacy, a topic that is highly relevant to students in our local area. Their WebQuest targeted 5th graders and integrated social studies, technology, reading and art, guiding students through an examination of the six tribes comprising the Iroquois Nation. Additionally, the WebQuest brought students to sites on conflict resolution and they were asked to critically assess their own methods of conflict resolution, comparing and contrasting their methods with those of the Iroquois. The final project required students to create a report on their findings as well as a group art project creating a wampum belt, often used as the symbolic language of the Iroquois, depicting their interpretation of the Iroquois.
